

Call to Order

Dr. Chell called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with a quorum of (12) members present.

Brown Act Invitation for Public Comment

No cards to speak were submitted from the public.

Jim Hummer provided for the Board's review copies of:

- 1. Comprehensive Donor Revenue Analysis from 07/01/2012
- 2. Brabo & Carlsen Management Letter from the 2011-2012 Audit
- 3. Letter dated December 13, 2012 to Gene Marchu from Jim Hummer

Review of donor revenue analysis. Percent Change Current Year vs. Prior Year was 35.63% with 99.44% of our donor base retained in 2012. It was noted that the marketing program was a definite factor in these very positive statistics but that these numbers do not reflect the challenging issues that the college has encountered in the press in the last few months.

The open letter to the community was discussed.

The successful campaign for the Barry Manilow Gift of Love concert series was discussed. The final numbers including the monies received from the promoters should be ready for the January board meeting.

Update on Marketing Program- Jim Hummer

In view of the FTES issue Jim informed the committee that he stopped the TV spots as well as the second Year-End mailing. The following alternatives were put forth for discussion:

- Continue to bring stories of students/supporters to community
- With awareness comes potential of donations.

B: Suspend until the Fall of 2013

The committee discussed whether to proceed or to suspend the spending of the already budgeted \$150K Phase III of the Step Up for COD campaign until next Fall.

It was M/S/C Bob Archer/Brian Holcombe that Jim Hummer proceed to engage Brian Harnik and CV Strategies to act as attorney and Crisis Management team to the Foundation Board of Directors. Jim can spend up to \$25K on the contract.

At this point in the meeting the Executive session was adjourned and minute taking was stopped to go into closed session with Attorney Brian Harnik to discuss and counsel the committee members on personnel and/or potential litigation matters.

The session resumed and minute taking resumed at 10:14 a.m.

It was M/S/C Marc Nickerson/Peggy Cravens to postpone the decision of whether to spend the \$150K on Phase III of the Marketing Plan until we get direction from CV Strategies.

Mary Jane Sanchez, newly elected COD Trustee, dropped by and introduced herslf to the Executive Committee.

Update on the COD Foundation Audit

Management Letter Recommendations from Brabo Carlsen, Foundation auditors, was read by all committee members as well as the letter that Jim wrote to Gene Marchu, Executive Director of the Alumni Association. The history of the Foundation's relationship with the Alumni was discussed. The dilemma, as outlined by Dr. Deas who is on the Alumni board, is the discrepancy between the amount donated for a specific activity and the expense of said activity. The unused balance that was requested is the issue.

Attorney Harnik pointed out the risks of the return of donations from an IRS point of view and the fact that the Foundation is relinquishing their control. If the board approved the audit he recommends that if we don't enter into a formal agreement with the Alumni Association that we should return all the monies held in their name.

It was M/S/C Brian Holcombe/Larry Spicer that Brian Harnik should work out a resolution to the issue with the Alumni Association lawyers

Call to Order

Chair Russ Russell called the meeting to order at 3:05 p.m.

Investment

Economic Outlook and Performance Review

Each committee member received reports from ML and WF (Merrill Lynch, Wells Fargo) of their portfolio review thru May 31, 2013. Committee members discussed that the Foundation should be able to evaluate the performance of our investments based on the target returns mentioned on page 5 of the ISP. "The return objective is an actuarially determined target of 6.0% net of fees". Both Merrill Lynch and Wells Fargo are mandated to use the investing guidance mentioned in the ISP. It is felt however that there should be a weighted benchmark used to evaluate the risk. Both ML and WF will be proposing such a benchmark at the next Investment meeting in September.

Investment portion of meeting was adjourned at 4:15 and the investment managers from ML and WF left conference room.

<u>Finance</u>

A. Review of May Financials

George Holliday, Foundation contract accountant, is here on a weekly basis. Due to this it is a challenge for him to have the Financials ready in time for this meeting. The May financials should be finished later this week and will be emailed to committee members. He requested another week. Committee members agreed to move the scheduled meetings up a week. Kippy will send out revised Outlook invitations to all.

B. The Foundation received an Amoco Stock Certificate dating from 1989 which was found by Bursar's Office. Russ Russell requested that a scan of it be sent to him. He will let us know how to proceed with its redemption.

- C. Moore Trust Foundation received the \$1.2MM (unrestricted) from the Moore Trust in May.
- D. Coeta Barker Endowment Fees

Nancy Harris requested an accounting of the Coeta Barker fund. On June 6, 2013, George Holliday, Jim Hummer and Nancy met to discuss the report. According to an arrangement with Ralph Plumb no management fee (approx. \$118,000) should have been charged. Nancy also said that this was not an endowment but was to be used for the maintenance of the building. George researched the file and could not find any information to support this. George and Jim are going to research and follow up with Nancy to establish a clear understanding in writing that would satisfy the donor's intent and provide the foundation documentation. After discussion the committee suggested that Brian Harnik be contacted for legal counsel before both Foundations meet to write a new agreement.

E. Schedule of Net Assets

The Foundation staff will be working on the consolidation of the 284 funds now present on our Schedule of Net Assets. Recommendations will be presented to the committee this Fall.

- F. George Holliday recommended the purchase of Sage (our accounting software) Cloudware which would enable him to work on our financials remotely. The \$1500 expenditure was accepted by the committee.
- G. In an effort to clarify the monthly financials, Russ Russell requested that George add a % variance column as well as a one page summary for any extraordinary. This will be covered in their monthly meeting before board meetings.

RE: SCHEDULE OF NET ASSETS CLEAN UP

We were tasked to review the Schedule of Net Assets and to try to understand why we had numerous Fund accounts that had a negative balance, a zero balance, had gone unused for years or had never been used. We had so many funds (347) that it was taking time and money to account for them all. These funds consisted of unused scholarships; unused program support funds and funds with titles which were unrecognizable. When we started the review of the Schedule of Net Assets, we had;

- 11 Unrestricted Funds includes the General Fund and Board Designated
- 258 Temporarily Restricted Funds includes Scholarships & designated Program support
- 16 Trust/Estate Funds includes CRT's and Gift Annuities
- 62 Permanently Restricted Funds includes Endowment and Capital Campaign Funds

Stage 1 - Determine the background and history of all the funds. We contacted the Financial Aid Office to provide information that they held on any of our funds. We sent our student worker over to their office to search their files. We searched active and dead files both paper and electronic. We turned over every stone and matched the found information with the funds.

Stage 2 – Quickly identify funds that could be easily recommended for closure or consolidation. We reviewed funds that had never been used for various reasons, we reviewed funds that held a zero balance, and we reviewed funds that supported programs that were never established or that ceased years ago.

Stage 3 – With the funds discovered in Stage 2, create a spreadsheet that list the "low hanging fruit Funds", including the Fund current balance, the history/background of the Fund, and staff's recommendation for the Fund to the Finance Committee. Next, present the findings to the Finance Committee.

Stage 4 – Identify funds that require some further review and research before recommendations can be made to the Finance Committee. These Funds would be ones that it is necessary for staff to contact the donor to make revisions that allow the fund to be used/consolidated, or are missing background/history or where the donor contact information is dated or lost. As time warrants, staff will continue the research on these funds to further insure funds that exist are able to be expended or meet an existing need rather than languishing in an inactive account.

Results

Staff has identified 50 easy changes to the Funds in Stage 2 and has made the following recommendations to the Finance Committee.

1. **Recommendation: Close Zero balance Funds**. 7 Funds have carried a zero balance and had no activity for many years.

- Recommendation: Transfer Funds to a similar account and close. 29 funds have had no activity, in some cases, ever.
 Others which have had no activity are very similar to other existing funds.
- 3. **Recommendation: Negative Balance Funds –Zero and Close.** 5 funds carry a negative balance and are not expected to have any additional monies added. Make the adjustment to bring the account to zero and close the account.
- 4. **Recommendation: Award balance and then close the fund.** Financial Aid will be asked to award scholarships in 2 funds which will deplete account. It will then be closed.
- 5. **Recommendation: Rename Fund to improve use**. 3 Funds have not been used due to a confusing name. Renaming the fund to more directly reflect its intended use.
- Recommendation: Negative Balance Hold to rebuild award. One fund currently carries a negative balance. The fund is tied to an endowment. Withhold the award for a year and reassess.
- 7. **Recommendation: Finance Committee review and policy needed**. Two large funds continue to be mistimed in revenue received and offsetting expenditures resulting in an increasing loss in the account. Guidance is required.
- 8. Recommendation: Use an existing general student scholarship account to act as "catch-all" for some of the fund transfers. The minimal balance is some of the smaller accounts that are being closed will need to be transferred to a catch all fund.

AGREEMENT FOR INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR SERVICES

This agreement made and entered into this 25th day of September, 2013, by and between the *COLLEGE OF THE DESERT FOUNDATION*, Riverside County, California, hereinafter referred to as the "FOUNDATION" and Peter Sturgeon hereinafter referred to as the "CONTRACTOR".

CONTRACTOR agrees to provide the FOUNDATION the services enumerated in Section 7 of this Agreement under the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Services shall begin on the 30th day of September 2013, and shall end upon the 31^{st} day of October, 2013.
- 2. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he and/or all of his employees are not employees of the FOUNDATION and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the FOUNDATION and/or to which FOUNDATION employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions including Unemployment Insurance, Social Security and Income Taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR'S employees.
- 3. CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at his own expense, all labor, materials, equipment and other items necessary to carry out the terms of this Agreement.
- 4. In the performance of the work herein contemplated, CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor per IRS Publication 15-A page 4, with the authority to control and direct the performance of the details of the work, FOUNDATION being interested only in the results obtained.
- 5. CONTRACTOR agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the FOUNDATION, its Board of Trustees, employees and agents from any and all liability or loss arising in any way out of CONTRACTOR'S negligence in the performance of this Agreement, including, but not limited to any claim due to and/or damage sustained by CONTRACTOR, injury and/or the CONTRACTOR'S employees or agents. FOUNDATION agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the CONTRACTOR, its employees and agents from any and all liability or loss arising in any way out of the negligence of the FOUNDATION, its employees or agents, including, but not limited to any claim due to injury and/or damage sustained by FOUNDATION, and/or FOUNDATION'S employees or agents.

- 6. Services to be rendered to the FOUNDATION by the CONTRACTOR are as follows:
 - a. The implementation of the Annual Giving Campaigns including the Business Circle Program and President's Circle Program, Country Club Outreach, Assist with Phase 2 of the "StepUpforCOD" campaign, Assist with Donor Development and Relations, and Sponsorship Solicitation. For details See Attachment A: scope of Work.
- 7. Neither party shall assign or delegate any part of this Agreement without the written consent of the other party.
- 8. The work completed herein must meet the approval of the FOUNDATION and shall be subject to the FOUNDATION'S general right of inspection and supervision to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all Federal, State, Municipal and FOUNDATION laws, rules and regulations that are now, or may in the future become applicable to CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR'S business, equipment and personnel engaged in operations covered by this Agreement or accruing out of the performance of such operations.
- 10. Payments will be made by the FOUNDATION to the CONTRACTOR as follows: All invoices for services shall be presented to the FOUNDATION office for approval. Payment shall be made within 22 working days of presentation of invoice.

Contractor shall be compensated a total amount not to exceed \$21,000, payable monthly at a rate of \$7,000 based on approved invoice.

11. This agreement may be terminated by either party notifying the other, in writing, no less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of termination.
